I qualified from the University of Aberdeen, UK with a Bachelor in Medicine and Surgery (MBChB) in 2007. I completed my 2-year internship (foundation) appointments in Scotland and subsequently moved to the north of England for basic surgical training. Subsequently I secured a National Training Number (NTN) in General Surgery in East of England spending half of my training (3 years) in hepatobiliary/liver transplant surgery in Addenbrooke's hospital, Cambridge. During my training tenure I was affiliated with the Cancer Research Institute (CRUK) in Cambridge conducting basic science experiments on the tumour immune properties of pancreatic cancer. I am on the UK's Specialist Register for General Surgery as of October 2022. Upon completion of my higher surgical training, I pursued further subspecialty training (fellowships) in advanced pancreatic, liver and liver transplant surgery in large hepatobiliary centres in Basingstoke and the internationally renowned Liver Unit in the Queen Elizabeth Hospital in Birmingham, UK. I have been working as a hepatobiliary and general surgeon in Cyprus since April 2024 and I see patients as part of the national healthcare system (GESY).
